The residents of Howard County, Maryland, have a lot to be proud of: top-ranked public schools, a robust recreation and parks program, and one of the lowest unemployment rates in the state. It's no wonder that Howard County has been cited in national surveys as among America's best places to live. The county – situated between the cities of Baltimore and Washington, D.C. – has grown dramatically in recent decades. Howard County is now home to around 290,000 people, and the county landscape has gone from a relatively rural area to a much more suburban one.

When Ira Levy joined Howard County as CIO a few years ago, he discovered that this transformation had pushed the county's existing business systems to their limit. "Our legacy systems were disassociated

and outdated," says Levy. "We definitely needed enterprise-level systems that were more aligned with how the county had evolved."

Officials such as Levy and deputy CIO Sandra Stecker wanted to ensure that the government's business operations could effectively support the county executive's vision for the future of Howard County. They recognized the potential for standardized business processes, improved control over public finances, and greater efficiencies in operations such as procurement and utilities. The goal was to modernize the business systems and enable Howard County to respond more quickly and cost-effectively to the needs of its constituents.

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A vote of confidence for integration

Howard County knew what it wanted in terms of new systems and business processes. “We needed an integrated solution that could handle the full range of public sector issues – from utilities to grant management,” recalls Levy. Further, the forward-looking county saw the opportunity to update business processes and accelerate the implementation using recognized best practices.

Howard County based its system search on a comprehensive requirements document that included specific milestones designed to ensure timely project completion. “We evaluated offerings from several vendors,” notes Stecker, “and we also contacted other governments to better understand their implementation experiences.”

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Benefits that extend beyond county lines

“Today, Howard County has the level of visibility and financial control you need in a US\$1.5 billion organization,” says Levy. Each department has the ability to drill down into its expenditures, and everyday operations such as procurement are performed with checks and balances following documented processes. “In the past, you could buy boots out of the consulting budget,” quips Levy.

in central Maryland, Howard County is managing a nearly \$100 million portion of a federal grant to implement new broadband technology across the state. The 1,000 miles of cable in this intercounty broadband network will ultimately connect over 1,000 schools, colleges, libraries, hospitals, and public safety facilities. “We couldn’t have managed this grant without our new system in place,” says Levy.

This improved control extends from the purchase of \$20 footwear to managing a multimillion-dollar grant. Taking the lead for 10 different jurisdictions

“With better financial management, our county departments can focus more of their time on core functions,” says Stecker. That means faster utility billing times and greater visibility for activities planning and costs by the Department of Recreation and Parks.

County officials are now planning to drive even tighter integration in functions such as treasury, supplier relationship management, and human resources. Howard County is also investigating mobile technologies to further empower its workforce of some 2,800 employees.

Whether it's high-speed broadband or online bill payments, Howard County remains in the vanguard of providing its constituents with modern, innovative, and sustainable public services.
